Sports Person of the Week

Albie in Year 6, Brambles. Albie had a brilliant start to our Tag Rugby topic. He came into the classroom first, started to do jobs, giving books out and then got on with the morning task. During PE he was helpful, engaged throughout, enthusiastic, listened to everything and helped to show some excellent demonstrations to the class using his previous knowledge to support the learning of others and showed ownership to manage their own team's game.

LMS Well-being

The science writer David Berreby wrote:

"It's not hard to see why humans should have evolved to care about their teams and their place in those teams. Relying on each other is a sound survival strategy for a frail, noisy creature without a lot of built-in weapons. Living in groups is a ticket to survival, which is why most primates live in them"

The one true competitive advantage we know is their strength in our togetherness, this is what gives us a fighting chance of 'survival'. We have the ability to form strongly bonded and highly effective groups. Isolation or rejection from a group used to spell premature death - but even now they both still terrify the hell out of us. To feel a sense of belonging is to feel accepted, to feel seen and to feel included by a group of people, believing that we fit in, trusting we will be protected by them. To not feel belonging is to experience the precarious and insecure sense of an outsider.

There has never been a time in human history when our well-being has **NOT** been tied to belonging to a group. Studies today reaffirm the correlation between chronic loneliness, poor health and early mortality. Also, after a heart attack, the strength of an individual's social network is a greater predictor of survivability than exercise, nutrition or medication.


