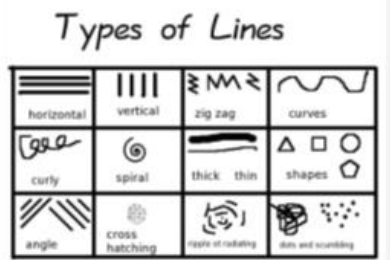

Key Vocabulary

Drawing- A picture or diagram made with a pencil, pen, or crayon rather than paint.	Line- Connection between two points. It can vary in length and size and direction.	Shape- the form or outline of something.	Observation- the action or process of closely observing or monitoring something or someone.	Abstract- modern art which does not represent images of our everyday world. It has colour, lines and shapes (form), but they are not intended to represent objects or living things.	Cartoon- a type of illustration, sometimes animated, typically in a non-realistic or semi-realistic style.
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Focus on drawing the basic shapes

Include key features such as the mouth, nose, ears, legs, tail, the size of the body.



Emphasise the different parts of the body with different shapes and sizes by using the lines (thick and thin)
