## How can we maintain a work-life balance while working remotely?

Remote work allows us to work flexibly and prioritise impact rather than be tied to a schedule. However, blending work and personal time can quickly lead to burnout. To avoid this, maintain clear boundaries between the two.

Have a dedicated workspace in your home (definitely don't work from your bed), stick to a clearly communicated schedule, and embrace asynchronous communication. Pause your notifications outside your set working hours so you don't feel pressured to respond. Few things are so urgent they can't wait until the following day.

Finally, if you're a manager or leader, measure people's contribution by what they deliver, not their work hours or how swiftly they respond. It requires trust, but this is what empowers distributed teams to thrive.
