Prohibition On So-Called 'Zombie Knives' - UK Government

From 24th September 2024, a new wave of prohibitions has been applied to individuals possessing and selling so-called Zombie knives. These blades take their name from a marketing ploy, being 'inspired' by shows and games such as the Walking Dead, The Last of Us, World War Z, etc.. Typically they'll be shaped in unusual manners to give them a more demonstrative 'cool' factor within certain subcultures. Government's legislative definition for these products is as follows: 1) Possesses a plain cutting edge; 2) A sharp pointed end; 3) A blade of 8"+ as measured from handle top to blade tip. The blade in question must also have at least one of the following features: I) A serrated cutting edge more than 2" next to the handle. II) More than one hole machined into the blade. III) Spikes. LMS Well-being

How well do we look out for ourselves and each other? Here are some things to look for and hints/tips to look for and try with ourselves and others:

- There is an unrealistic pressure to notice everything in your children all the time the key is giving ourselves the best shot of doing this take your parent mask off in your down time.


