As you are aware, we have **FLU VACCINATIONS** taking place in school on 12th December. Parents who wish to consent to their child having this year's flu vaccination should follow the link that has been emailed out by 9am on Tuesday December 10th. Flu can be a very unpleasant illness in children causing fever, extreme tiredness, aching muscles and joints, stuffy nose, dry cough, and sore throat. Children usually begin to feel better within about a week. Complications of flu include acute bronchitis, painful ear infections, and pneumonia. Some children may need to go to hospital for treatment, including intensive care. Having the vaccine will help protect your child from what can be a very nasty illness in children. It will also reduce the chance of others in your family who could be at greater risk from flu (such as grandparents or those with long term health conditions) from getting flu from your child. It can help you avoid having to take time off work or other activities to look after your sick child or if you become sick yourself.

Our successful **STAY AND PLAY** sessions carry on next year, starting on January 15th with a **FARM** theme. These under 5 sessions are a great way to meet new people and find out more about our school. All of this great fun for $\pounds I$. Please see all the dates for next year attached further on.

A Note on Dangerous Gifts - Child Accident Prevention Trust

Before long mince pies, Mariah Carey and mysteriously familiar Santa Clauses will make their way into our lives. This is all in good fun, and children from Lands End to John O'Groats look forward to the build up to Christmas all year.

However, not all presents are created equally. More than ever our Christmas shopping is done online from an increasingly varied list of providers. From imitation manufacturers, to sellers platforms like Etsy and to third party small businesses that use known provider logistics services, we're all trusting people ever further removed from us to provide high quality goods. Unfortunately this is far from guaranteed. Production firms abroad or within a 'cottage industry' may not have the strict manufacturing standards applied in the UK, or expected as industry standard. How to combat procrastination and boost productivity.

"You cannot escape the responsibility of tomorrow by evading it today."- Abraham Lincoln

One of the main problems with procrastination (apart from stopping people from accomplishing what matters) is that it's so easy to do. To combat this, it's best to develop systems for behaviour management rather than relying on willpower or discipline. By understanding how you procrastinate, you can become better at recognising when you're procrastinating and proactively adopt strategies to start taking action and get unstuck.

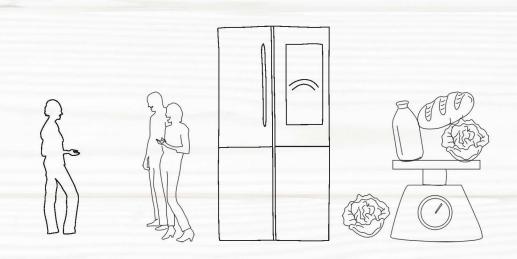
