We remain committed to providing enriching opportunities beyond the classroom and thank you for your understanding and continued support.

Harmful Content Trends 2024 – Southwest Grid for Learning

The South West Grid for Learning (SWGfL) has recently published its Harmful Content Report 2024, commissioned last year. The report reveals a 20.5% year -on-year increase in harmful content cases, with 6,222 reports handled over the past 12 months. In 86% of cases, harmful content was successfully removed—often within hours—and nearly half were resolved within 24 hours. Notably, 24% of the reports involved children under 18, with a significant number concerning those under 12. The report also highlights that 37% of harmful content was hosted on smaller or less regulated platforms, pointing to a growing risk in these online spaces. As demand for impartial, trusted support continues to grow, SWGfL is expanding its guidance and service provision to better support those affected. Reflections about the concept of antifragility.

"Every step you take toward antifragility makes you less vulnerable to the future." — Nassim Nicholas Taleb

We often talk about the importance of resilience. But what if we could go one step further—not just weathering the storm of uncertainty or bouncing back from adversity, but using it as a catalyst for growth? That's the antifragile mindset. So much personal development advice centres on optimising every aspect of life, but antifragile individuals take the opposite approach. Instead of obsessing over perfectly dialled-in routines, they create simple, flexible systems with built-in redundancy, ensuring there's always another way forward when plans unravel.

By becoming adaptable and seeing challenges as an opportunity to grow, we can help them embrace, rather than avoid, risk—and, crucially, unlock the capacity to thrive, not just survive, in turbulent times. That is the power of antifragility.

"Where in your life do you have a single point of failure, and how might you create redundancy?" This question helps you identify areas of fragility in your life and encourages proactive problem-solving, prompting you to build buffers to absorb potential shocks and create alternate pathways to success in the face of adversity.




