LONG MEADOW SCHOOL

Our aim is for the children to have a smooth transition from Early Years into Year 1 and so onto Year 2 (Key Stage 1).

Learning expectations:

- Children show a can-do attitude towards given learning tasks.
- Children can work in a small group, pair or independently.
- Children ask for support and learn what tools are available to help them.



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In Year 1 children have:



- A similar learning environment to Early Years, with practical and hands on experiences.
- A stronger focus on accountability and responsibility for resources and toys
- Increased learning group sizes



- The behavioural trackit lights system will still be used in Year 1 as this is a whole school system.
- 10 points- individual reward
- 500 points – whole class reward
- Individual reward systems as and when appropriate.



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Supporting individuals:



- NO two children are the same and there is differentiation in learning tasks so that all children receive challenge in their learning or scaffolded support as and when needed.

Programmes of study, such as RWI allow for group learning with additional support/ further challenge for children as they work.

Support (scaffold) tools are readily available and children are encouraged to know what there is for them and when to use them.



RWI

- Whole school approach to teaching Literacy
- Taught by Teachers and LSAs
- Groups of 4-30 according to progress
- Assessments are carried out half termly



RWI continued



- 'Fred Talk, Say the word'
- RWI BookBag Books (coloured) for the children to read
- Library and picture books to be read by you
- Record in reading journal

Reading Journals & RWI Books

In Year 2, we encourage the children to change their own books.

On Fridays, reading journals will be checked and RWI books will be changed during RWI sessions.

50/50 books – children can change these themselves, but will be checked on Fridays

RWI books not returned will receive a letter home.

Home Learning



Play a game with someone you live with. You could create the game yourself or play one you have at home.




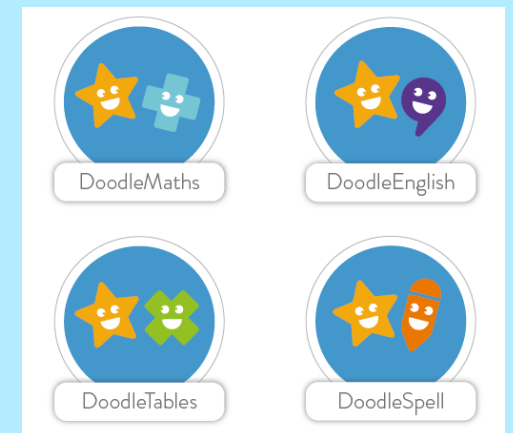
Make a den out of blankets and pillows. Inside or outside if the weather is nice. You could sit on do some colouring or watch a film in there.

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FAQ:

What can I do to help my child at home?

Read read read! Anything and everything- change it up; short, positive reading times.

Is it ok for my child to bring in things for special occasions e.g. their birthday?

Yes- any things brought in to class will be distributed at the end of the day, for parents to decide what their child will have when they get home.

I can't find an item of clothing/Child's belongings. What can I do?

Our class has its own lost property box. This is placed outside of the class door. By Friday each week, it is emptied and items are placed in the Foyer in the storage boxes there.

What does my child need?

A water bottle and snack every day. A packed lunch, if they are not having school dinners. Everything else e.g. pencils etc are provided by school. Please do not bring in toys or pencil cases.
