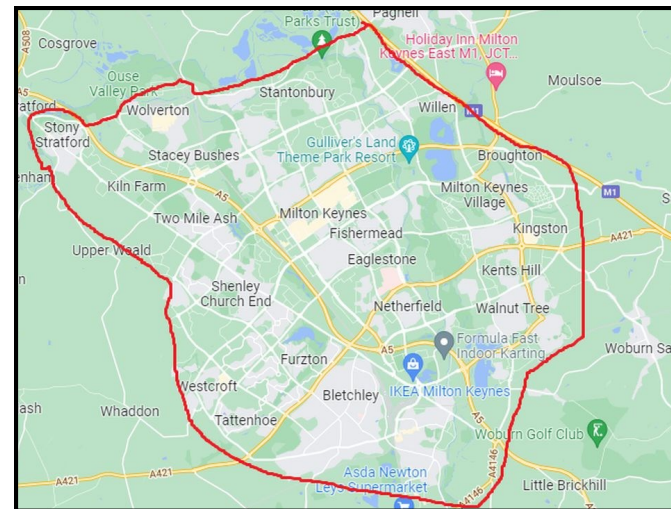

What should I already know?

- I live in **Milton Keynes** which is a **City** in **England**.
- There are **four countries** which make up the **United Kingdom**: **England, Wales, Northern Ireland, Scotland**
- A **continent** is a large area of land that is separated from others by water or other natural objects
- There are **seven continents**: **Antarctica, Asia, Australasia, Europe, Africa, North America, South America**
- The **equator** is an imaginary line that divides the world in half into two **hemispheres** (**Northern** and **Southern**).
- The closer to the equator, the hotter it is as the **sun** is the closest to the **Earth** there.

Geographical Skills

Main Foci: Weather in the UK and around the world

What should I already know?

- The weather is what happens outside.
- The world travels around the sun.
- Which countries are hot and which are cold.
- The equator is the imaginary line that runs around the centre of the Earth. The countries closest to it are the hottest.
- There are two hemispheres, the Northern with the North Pole, and the Southern, with the South Pole.
- What it is like to live in a hot and cold country.

- Name and locate the world's **seven continents** and **five oceans**.
- Name, locate and identify characteristics of the four **countries** and **capital cities** of the **United Kingdom**.
- Identify seasonal and daily **weather patterns** in the United Kingdom and the **location of hot and cold areas** of the world
- Locate the **Equator** and the **North and South Poles**.
- Use world **maps**, atlases and globes.
